

OUR STORY



Since its founding in 2005 the Thailand Phil has been a significant force in Thailand's musical and cultural scene, always pushing forward to promote the appreciation of orchestral music and music education in Thai society. Under the musical leadership of Chief Conductor Alfonso Scarano the orchestra has earned worldwide recognition for its performances of orchestral masterworks as well as promoting new works, especially those of Thai composers.

The Thailand Phil has performed for audiences the world over. The orchestra recently embarked on their 2022 European Tour, the first-ever tour of Europe by a Thai orchestra. The orchestra received standing ovations in in Budapest, Hungary, Ljubljana, Slovenia, and Wrocław, Poland. The orchestra has toured throughout Thailand, Southeast Asia, Japan, and New Zealand.

The Thailand Phil operates in close partnership with the Mahidol University College of Music. This symbiotic relationship is central to the orchestra's primary mission: to be a model of excellence by providing world-class concert experiences and educational opportunities. Thailand Phil has performed with leading conductors and soloists including Kahchun Wong, Carl St.Clair, Calogero Palermo, Kristóf Baráti, Dimitri Ashkenazy, Stefano Bollani, Sergei Nakariakov, and Boston Brass. The Thailand Phil has cultivated an



international presence with concerts in Japan, New Zealand, Laos, Myanmar, Malaysia, and most recently a tour of major European cities.

The Thailand Phil makes its performing home at the state-of-theart 2000-seat Prince Mahidol Hall on the campus of the College of Music, Mahidol University in western Bangkok. The hall is situated in lush green surroundings, away from the bustle of central Bangkok, where concertgoers can enjoy the quiet gardens and sculptures of the music campus. The orchestra performs over forty concerts a year in this hall and regularly performs special concerts in other locations throughout Bangkok.

Now in its 18th season, the Thailand Phil has become a musical leader in Thailand and Southeast Asia. For the first twelve seasons the orchestra was led by its Founding Chief Conductor, Maestro Gudni Emilsson, who shaped the Thailand Phil into the internationally-recognized ensemble it is today. In its thirteenth season Maestro Alfonso Scarano accepted the post of Chief Conductor and continues to build on the orchestra's strong foundation, traditions, and international reputation.

Moving into the future the Thailand Phil aims to be an orchestra in touch with its audience, with a core mission to promote the advancement of classical music in Thailand by offering world-class concert experiences to its audience, students, and the community.

Chief Conductor

Italian conductor Alfonso Scarano is currently in his sixth season as Chief Conductor of the Thailand Philharmonic Orchestra after having served as Guest Conductor for six consecutive seasons since 2011/2012.

For 12 years Alfonso Scarano has shaped an unmistakable sound culture as conductor of the Thailand Phil culminated with the first acclaimed European tour held in August/September 2022, the CD recording for Albany Records USA and the praised live performances and recording of the Bruckner 9th.

His previous positions include Chief Conductor of the Severočeská Filharmonie Teplice (2013 – 2018), Principal Guest Conductor of the Virtuosi di Praga (2000 – 2010) and Music Director and Conductor of the Toscana Opera Festival in Italy (2006 – 2008).

Alfonso Scarano was the winner of the 1993 Bottega International Conducting Competition in Treviso, winner of the 1997 Franco Capuana European Community Conducting Competition in Rome, second prize (first and third not assigned) at 2005 Luigi Mancinelli International Conducting Competition in Orvieto and recipient of 2003 Young European Conductors scholarship for Daniele Gatti biennial conducting course at Scuola di Musica in Fiesole in Italy.

In addition to his position in Bangkok, Alfonso Scarano regularly conducts worldwide orchestras included the Jerusalem Symphony Orchestra in Israel, Orquestra Sinfonica de Porto Alegre in Brazil,

The New Russia State Symphony Orchestra in Moscow Tchaikovsky Hall, IDSO Istanbul State Symphony Orchestra in Turkey, Daejeon Philharmonic Orchestra in South Korea, Savaria Symphony Orchestra in Hungary, Kiev National Radio Television Symphony Orchestra, Orchestra del Teatro Regio di Parma in Italy, Helsingborg Symphony Orchestra in Sweden and PKF-Prague Philharmonia touring in Germany and Bulgaria.

His relationships with leading vocal and instrumental soloists have included collaborations with Mischa Maisky, Mario Brunello, Kristof Barati, Yu-Chien Tseng, Nikita Boriso-Glebsky, Anton Sorokow, Stefano Bollani, Nareh Arghamanyan, Francois-Joel Thiollier, Jorg Demus, Alexander Toradze, Calogero Palermo, Tatjana Masurenko, Daniela Dessi, Betty Garces, Krysty Swann, Simone Alaimo, Maria Jose' Siri, Dimitra Theodossiou, Kristjan Johannsson, Stefan Margita and many others.

Alfonso Scarano has conducted the mainstays of operatic repertoire including La traviata, Nabucco, Rigoletto, Tosca, Madama Butterfly, La bohème, La sonnambula, Lucia di Lammermoor, Don Pasquale, Cavalleria rusticana, Pagliacci, Carmen, Il barbiere di Siviglia, Gianni Schicchi and Gluck's opera Le cinesi in theatres such us Politeama Greco in Lecce, Teatro Sperimentale in Spoleto, Teatro Civico in Vercelli, Teatro Comunale in Treviso, Pompei Festival, Anfiteatro Romano di Ostia Antica in Roma, Teatro Nuovo Giovanni da Udine, Stagione Lirica in San Gimignano, Friedrichshafen Theater, Freiburg Theater, Roman Amphitheater in Plovdiv and Prince Mahidol Hall in Banqkok.

A supporter of the contemporary music, he has conducted several works (some in first world performance) by Aharon Harlap, Gerhard Kaufmann, Narong Prangcharoen, Piyawat Louilarpprasert, Simon Laks, Paolo Ugoletti, Roberto Di Marino, Renato Dionisi, Ede Terényi, Fredrik Osterling, Colin Riley and many others.

Besides the classic ballets (Swan Lake, Don Quixote and Raymonda), Alfonso Scarano has concentrated its attention on the historical twentieth century repertoire conducting La Giara by Alfredo Casella, Romeo and Juliet by Prokofiev and Apollon Musagete by Stravinsky. The international dance gala conducted at Mittelfest 2009, 2010 and 2011 was enthusiastically reviewed by the press. He has collaborated with the greatest dancers of the world and particularly with etoiles from Wiener Staatsoper, Ljubljana Ballet, Hamburg Ballet, American Ballet Theatre, New York City Ballet, Ballet du Capitole de Toulouse, Ballet de l'Opèra de Paris and Birmingham Royal Ballet. In 2011 he has conducted the first performance of the ballet The Death and the Maiden by Schubert in the version for orchestra by Gustav Mahler, new creation of the Balletto di Roma.

His discography includes recordings for Tactus (first world recording of the Suite for organ and orchestra by Respighi), Lupulus (works of Verdi, Puccini, Donizetti with Virtuosi di Praga), Triart (Menschheit op.28 by Erwin Schulhoff and Mahler's Kindertotenlieder) as well as several Thai music CD recorded with Thailand Philharmonic Orchestra.

Alfonso Scarano is graduated summa cum laude in Conducting (Conservatorio Umberto Giordano in Foggia), Opera Conducting (Accademia Musicale Pescarese) as well as in Choral Conducting (Conservatorio Niccolò Piccinni in Bari) and Trumpet (Conservatorio Tito Schipa in Lecce).




